

## **WATER REPORT – June 6, 2023**

The above-average snowpack that we had back on April 1<sup>st</sup> has quickly melted. The few SNOTEL sites that still have remaining snow have less snow water equivalent remaining than they had on this same date last year. Fortunately, the persistent rain showers experienced over the last several weeks have allowed a greater amount of snowmelt runoff to be stored in the reservoirs than otherwise would have occurred if it had not been for the wet weather and low diversion demand.

Additional rain showers are forecasted to occur later this week. If they materialize and result in keeping natural flow diversions relatively steady, reservoirs will continue to accrue additional storage through at least this week. Whether or not upcoming rains will be sufficient to keep diversion demand low and completely fill the reservoir system over the next few weeks remains to be seen.

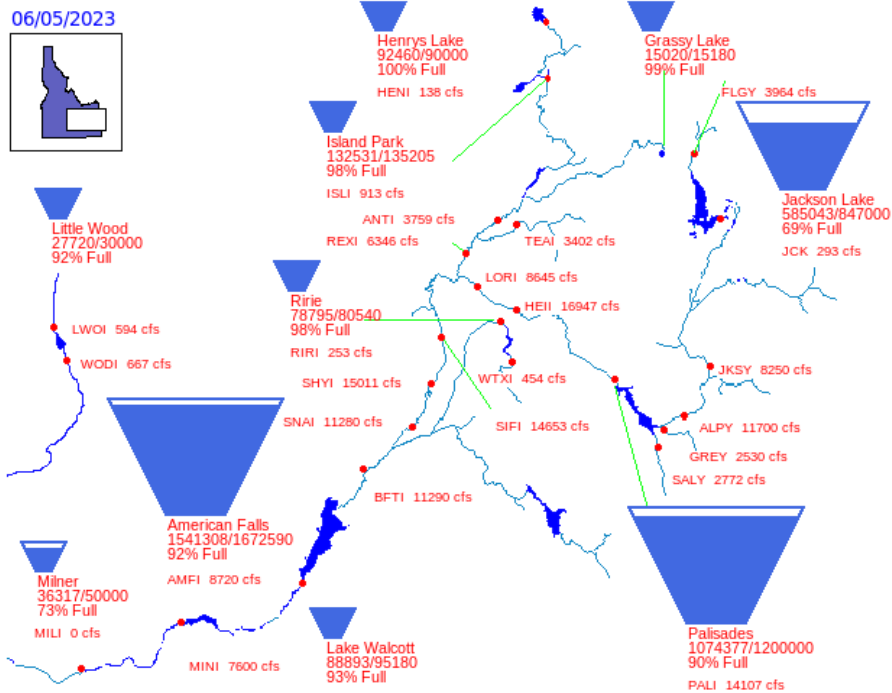
